Why An OTC Drive?

On average every dollar spent by consumers on OTC medicines saves \$6-7 for the U.S. healthcare system as a whole. NC MedAssist generates more than \$52 million in healthcare costs avoidance through its distribution of OTC medicine in FY24.

Hosting an OTC Donation Drive



Step 1: Choose How You'll Host Your Drive

Virtual

This means you'll work with NC MedAssist to create an Amazon wishlist of our most needed OTC medication and have them delivered to our warehouse.

In-Person

If you are organizing an in-person drive, you'll want to decide the best place for the collection boxes. We recommend an office space or scheduling a volunteer session at our warehouse and bringing them with you!

Step 2: Schedule Your Drive

Determine how long you want your donation drive to run. OTC Drives can last a week or a month - even a day!

Step 3: Spread The Word

You'll receive a toolkit with marketing materials and more to help your spread the word about your drive and start getting donations!

How Your Donations Are Distributed

Over-the-Counter medication access is critical to decrease unnecessary hospital visits and alleviate everyday aches and pains that could result in low quality of life and potentially missing work.

OTC Free Store

The OTC Free Store houses durable medical supplies and OTC medicine, such as pain relief, cold and cough, allergy, digestive, vitamins, children's medicine, and more.

The store is open to all NC residents with no financial requirements. Guests can shop once a month in the store during our regular hours or pre-order on our website and select a pick-up time that is convenient for them.



Mobile Free Pharmacy



NC MedAssist travels statewide to bring OTC medicine to our neighbors in need. We visit a different community each week and work with a volunteer committee to ensure other safety-net organizations are available to provide support to those who attend. Our MFP program has visited over 75 of the 100 counties across NC.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why host an OTC drive?

The OTC donation drive is a way to support NC MedAssist in collecting essential non-prescriptions for North Carolina residents in need. Who can organize an OTC drive?

Anyone can organize an OTC drive! Individuals, community groups, schools, businesses, and organizations are all welcome to participate. It is a great way for communities to come together and support the health and well-being of fellow North Carolina residents.

What are the types of OTC drives?

OTC drives can take various forms. They can be organized as standalone events, integrated into existing community gatherings, or through corporate events. They can be one-time events or ongoing campaigns depending on the organizer's preference.

What products should be collected?

The products that are typically in high demand for OTC drives include common over-the-counter medications like pain relievers, cold and flu remedies, and allergy medications, as well as basic medical supplies like bandages and first aid kits.

How can I promote my donation drive?

Promoting your OTC drive can be done through various channels, including social media, flyers, emails, local community boards, and word of mouth. Utilizing different platforms can help reach more individuals and increase support.

Over-The-Counter Medicine Donation Drive

Items to collect:

ITEMS IN CRITICAL NEED

- Sunscreen
- Deodorant
- Dry Shampoo
- Children's Pepto
- First Aid
- Pregnancy tests
- Excedrin
- Imodium/Anti-Diarrheal
- Lidocaine patches
- Lactaid/Anti-gas
- ACE Wraps
- Pain Relief (Acetaminophen, Ibuprofen, Aspirin, Muscle Rub)
- Cold/Flu (Cough Drops, DayQuil, NyQuil, Tussin, Mucinex)
- Allergy (Claritin, Zyrtec, Benadryl, Nasal Spray)
- Diphenhydramine (Benadryl, ZZZQuil)
- Children's (Pain Relief, Allergy, Cold/Flu)
- Sleep Aid (ZZZQuil, Melatonin)
- Digestive (Nexium, Pepcid, Tums, Pepto Bismol, Imodium)
- Skin (Anti-fungal, Anti-itch, Chapstick, Sunscreen, Aloe)
- Urinary Pain Relief (Cystex, AZO)
- First Aid (Band-aids, alcohol, peroxide, gauze, medical tape, gloves, masks)
- Multi-Vitamin (Men's, Women's, Children's)
- Women's Health (Yeast infection treatment, pregnancy tests, feminine hygiene products)
- Adult Diapers / Diaper Rash Cream
- Hygiene/Toiletries (deodorant, toothpaste/brushes, soap, shampoo, face wash)

*** Brand names are included for reference only; generic equivalents are equally acceptable. ***

Donation Guidelines

To ensure the safety and well-being of those we serve, we kindly ask that all items meet the following criteria:

Sealed and Unopened:

Items must be in their original, sealed packaging.

Expiration:

Products must have at least 3 months remaining before expiration.

Storage:

Items must not require refrigeration.
